


# LO7.1/7.2 Your final presentation to a specified audience

It's a personal topic to me


Feel as though it needs more representation online

## The creative decisions that went well






Producing a short film at the start of the doc (hooks the audience in, making them think and question what it is that they're watching – why this is happening to the protagonist) Include a mother and professional as well as those with misophonia – I think this is important as an audience member as you get two different perspectives



Creative decision to inter-cut what the interviewees are saying in order to back each of them up with one another

Listening to my interviewees needs over my wants (waveform)








One of my interviewees backed out of being a part of it – managed to talk it through with them and discuss the minimum that they'd need to do. When they got into the actual interview it was absolutely fine

Struggling to edit scene 1. I found it very hard to make it feel engaging and how I had originally envisioned it. However, I managed to trust the process and work hard.


